The mansion at Bruce more was built using two different design styles - Queen Anne in the 1880s and Craftsman in the 1910s. Can you identify the different styles?

Queen Anne homes are often irregular in shape (not square or rectangular) and are decorated with unique details. Can you spot these features pictured on the left and match them to the name on the right?



Chimney Caps

Fancy brickwork or stonework near the top of a chimney

Oriel

A window that sticks out from the wall on an upper story



Patterned Masonry

Terra-cotta or stone panels built into the walls

Fishscale Pattern

Shingles made of a type of stone called slate that overlap on the roof and walls, and look like fishscales



Craftsman homes often look bold and rustic. Can you spot the Craftsman style features on any of the mansion's outdoor porches?



Overhanging Roof

Extended rooflines create dramatic overhangs

Exposed Rafters

Rafters jut out visibly from below the roofline



Tapered Square Columns

Square columns support the Craftsman style porches



The Douglasses added Craftsman features including porches and a terrace to update their Queen Anne home. The Douglasses also added Craftsman style buildings in the Servants' Village
